In his time, **KENNY LOGGINS** has been a guitar-slinger with a psychedelic rock band, a hot young songwriter with a publishing deal, half of a legendary country-rock duo, a massively successful and accomplished solo artist, a sonic pioneer in the smooth jazz genre, a reigning soundtrack superstar, a rocker, a seeker, as well as an enduring recording artist and live performer. His most recent works have spoken deeply to both young audiences and decidedly adult and worldly concerns. At the heart of it all, there remains a brilliant singer-songwriter and guitarist with a lifelong passion for exploring the endless power of the song to communicate.

By any standard, Kenny's commercial impact has been extraordinary. Twelve of his albums have gone platinum and beyond. In a world of one hit wonders and 15 minute sensations, Loggins has enjoyed hit songs in four straight decades -- remarkable testament to his exceptional craftsmanship and stamina. The songs? *The House at Pooh Corner, Celebrate Me Home, Meet Me Halfway, Heart to Heart, Your Mama Don't Dance, Vahevela, Angry Eye's, Danny's Song, Watching the River Run, Whenever I Call You Friend*, are some of the titles. The Movie song track hits? *Highway to the Danger Zone* (from "Top Gun"), *Footloose, I'm Alright* (from "Caddyshack").

Yet the true measure of this man cannot be weighed in platinum and gold. Through it all, Kenny Loggins has earned the faith of those who followed him along the way. To this day, Loggins continues to write and record at the height of his powers as a singer and a songwriter. This is something that Loggins proves every time he takes the stage to sing his soulful songs straight from the heart. And straight to you, on September 18, from the lakefront stage.

Delegate Election News

It is time once again to elect your District Delegate to Lake Mission Viejo Association. The list of delegates adjacent to this article represents the current delegates for all districts in LMVA. There are two types of delegate elections held annually. Sub Associations to LMVA elect their own delegates during their annual Board of Director elections. LMVA assists Non Sub Association districts with the process explained below. Delegate representatives from all districts then elect members of the Board of Directors at the annual meeting held each year in late October.

District Delegate Non-Sub Association Meetings on Tuesday, October 5 at 7 p.m.

The first step in the process is the District Delegate Non-Sub Association Meetings, to be held concurrently, on Tuesday, October 5 at 7 p.m. in the LMVA Administrative Building. These annual meetings are held to elect District Delegates in all Non-Sub Association Delegate Districts. A quorum of twenty-five percent (25%) of members represented in person or by written proxy is required to conduct business in a Delegate District. Each Delegate District is required to conduct business in a Delegate District. Each Delegate District is considered a separate meeting. It is not too early to consider who your District Delegate is and to contact your Delegate to talk about their accomplishments over the past year and their intentions for next year.

Reconvened Meetings on Tuesday, October 12 at 7 p.m.

On Tuesday, October 12 at 7 p.m. in the LMVA Administration Building the reconvened meetings of the Non-Sub Association Districts that did not reach a quorum at the October 7 meeting will be held. The twenty-five percent (25%) quorum requirement is also required at these reconvened meetings. The October Board of Directors Meeting will be held immediately following the Non-Sub Association District reconvened meetings.

Candidates Forum on Tuesday October 26 at 6 p.m.

A Candidates Forum is scheduled for Tuesday October 26 at 6 p.m. in the Lake Clubhouse for any member wishing to speak on the upcoming Board Elections or any issue they want to address concerning the Lake Association.

Board of Directors Election on Tuesday, October 26 at 7 p.m.

The culmination of the election process occurs following the Candidates Forum on Tuesday, October 26 at 7 p.m. with the Annual Meeting of the Lake Delegates. The election of the Board of Directors takes place at this meeting. Three Board positions are up for election in 2010. A quorum of District Delegates representing fifty-one percent (51%) of the membership is required to conduct the election. The District Delegates will then cast votes to elect Board positions.

LMVA members are invited to attend all of the meetings in the election process. This gives members an opportunity to support their District Delegate and to meet the individuals who are seeking to serve on the LMVA Board of Directors.

Take Pride in Completing Your Proxy - Pronto!

Was there a proxy included in your assessment bill this June? Proxies are mailed to facilitate the LMVA Election of District Delegates which takes place in October. If you do not plan to attend the election proceedings in person, complete the proxy and mail it back to LMVA. Proxies are also available at the LMVA Office if you cannot locate your copy. There are several options for completing your proxy.

1. You may designate the current LMVA Board of Directors.
2. You may name and designate any Lake Association member other than yourself to vote your proxy.
3. You may indicate that you want your proxy counted toward the quorum requirements for the election meeting(s) to help meet the 25% quorum requirements to conduct business.

LMVA members living in the "sub-associations" do not receive proxies. These "sub-associations" each elect their LMVA District Delegate at their Board of Directors meetings as required by the sub-association's governing documents. CALLING ALL ANGLERS

Start Preparing Now, Rainbow Trout Arrive in November

On Saturday, November 21, LMVA will celebrate 34 years of some of the best trout angling Southern California has to offer. Once again the lake will be stocked with beautiful rainbow trout for members and their guests to catch. Many memorable fishing days have been enjoyed by LMV anglers over the past three decades. There are few places in the world that can rival the trout fishing experience available at LMV.

OPENING DAY: NOT FAR AWAY

This approaching trout fishing season looks to be another exciting year for Lake anglers. Lake Biologist Tom Buckowski is watching the water temperatures and conditions closely to make sure the lake environment is ready for all those trout on the way. The Lake will be stocked sometime during the week before November 21. About 8,000 pounds of rainbow trout will be delivered from Lassen Trout farm in northern California. Fishing will be closed from the initial stock until 6 a.m., Saturday, November 21. The next stock of trout is scheduled for the week of November 30 - December 3, when an additional 4,000 pounds of trout will be delivered. Following each stocking the Lake will be closed for the remainder of the day. This allows the fish to spread out and acclimate to the Lake conditions.

Lake trout anglers should dust off their fishing gear or, better yet, head on down to the Tackle Box to buy some new equipment. Then get ready for lots of good family fun all season long, starting on November 21.

ATTENTION!

You Just HAVE to Read This Article! Only YOU Can Help Protect the Lake's Ecology

Our apologies to those who regularly read these *Noticia* articles, but we cannot say it enough: **Please don't dump anything in the Lake!**

Be it a deliberate release of an unwanted aquatic pet or the unintentional importation of foreign water in boats, equipment or toys, even microscopic organisms stowing away from previous excursions to other lakes can result in invasive pest introduction. "Clean and dry" is the best rule of thumb when bringing anything to the Lake.

Since we began stringent boat inspections and quarantines over two years ago primarily against the Quagga and Zebra Mussels, almost 8000 boats have been tagged and allowed to enter LMV waters. All boats are subject to a 30-day quarantine to make sure they were clean, dry and free of Mussels or potentially contaminated water. Our boat use requirements include inspections and quarantines of all boats that enter LMV in addition to the requirement that all watercrafts need to be insured and registered with a current LMVA registration sticker affixed to the vessel.

Boats entering the property are required to exhibit an LMVA quarantine tag, proving that they have not launched elsewhere for at least 30 days. Additionally, they are required to pass an inspection at launch proving that the vessel is clean and dry. This emergency legislation was enacted at the May 2008 Board of Directors meeting. Boats that exit LMV are issued a green tag which allows that vessel to immediately return to LMV without the 30-day quarantine. Tags are fixed to the boat and trailer in such a way that the boat cannot be launched without breaking the tag. Broken tags require the 30-day quarantine and tampered tags that attempt to cheat our quarantine system will be subject to disciplinary actions by our Board of Directors.

We are regularly testing our Lake water at Scripps for evidence of the Mussel as well as our surveys through underwater sampling substrates. So far LMV is clean and we hope to keep it that way with your help.

Remember: Never release any plant or animal into LMV – or any other environment. Examples of damage that invasive plants or animals can level on a system are plentiful and are seldom reversible. Lake Mission Viejo was built with a lot of forethought to ensure long-term water quality.

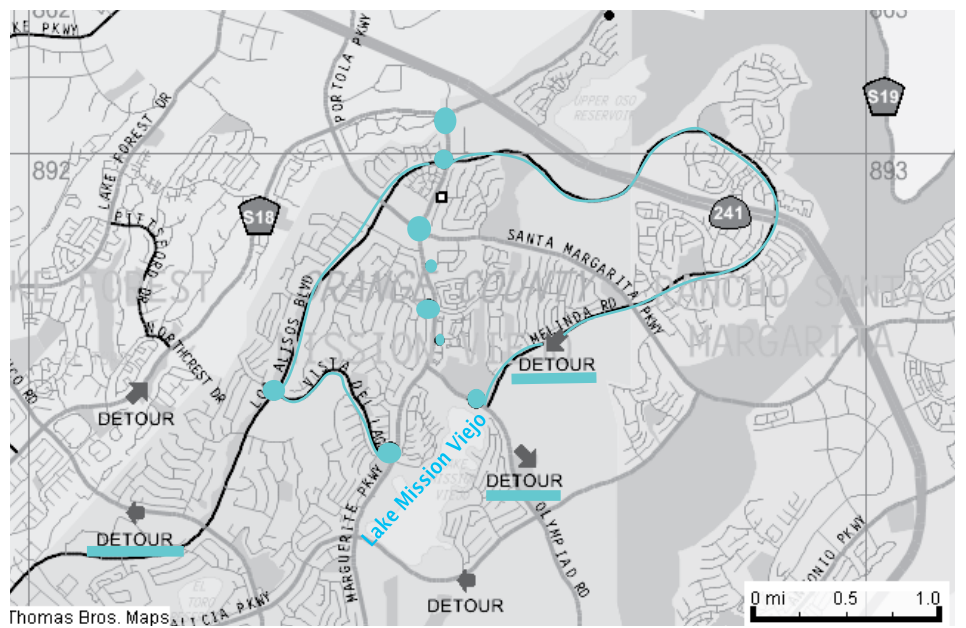
Schedule of Closures
